This report profiles active Litigation Section members with membership in the State Bar of Texas as of December 31, 2017. Not all demographic data is provided by every attorney. Separate population totals are provided in italics in each category that is lacking all demographic data. Percentages may not sum to one hundred due to rounding. Over the last 10 years the number of Litigation Section members has increased by 9 percent, growing from 7,769 attorneys in 2007 to 8,469 in 2017.
