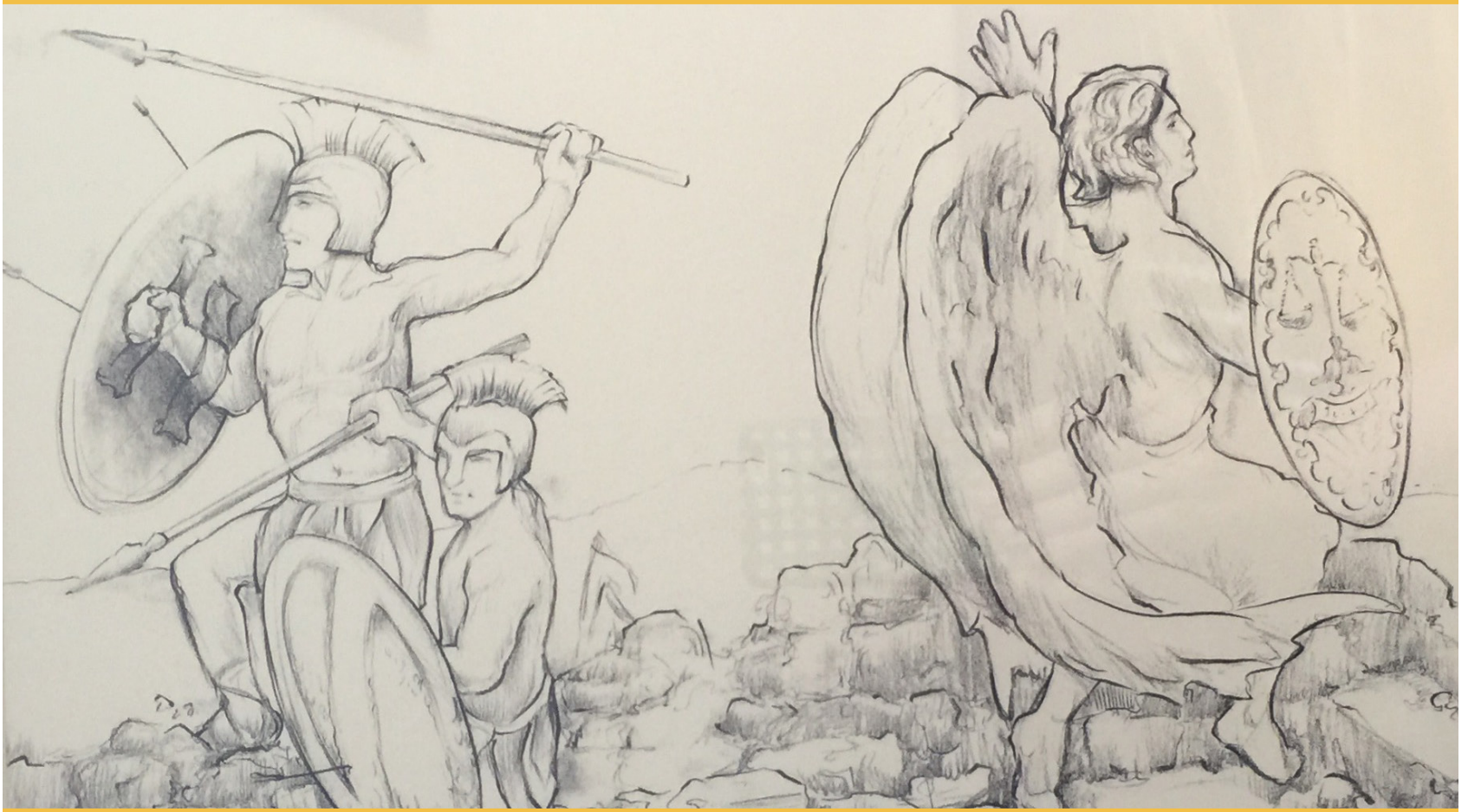

ABOUT THE WARRIOR DEFENSE PROJECT

The Warrior Defense Project (WDP) is a nationally recognized research center dedicated to the study of military legal and policy issues, with an emphasis on providing free legal services to service members wrongfully accused of misconduct.

In conjunction with a staff of subject matter experts, the WDP is able to engage in top to bottom research, study and analysis to determine the full legal ramifications of associated issues.

OBJECTIVE

The Warrior Defense Project is an educational and working institution which operates hand-in-hand with government, business and academia on a variety of legal matters associated with providing legal services to deserving service members. The WDP believes that over time a body of knowledge will be developed from lessons learned while assisting service members in need. We intend to use that knowledge to create fixed templates to more efficiently manage legal issues in future cases.

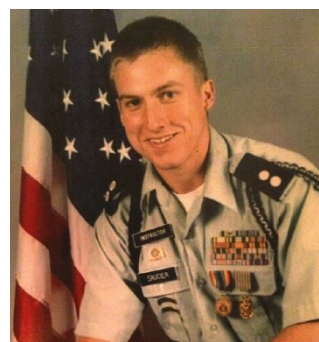

Jeffrey Addicott, J.D., LL.M., S.J.D., is Professor of Law and Director of the Warrior Defense Project at St. Mary's School of Law. He spent 20 years on active duty as an officer in the U.S. Army Judge Advocate General's Corps, and five years as a senior legal adviser to the U.S. Armed Forces.

As an internationally recognized expert in national security law, he has delivered more than 900 speeches and participates in professional and academic organizations in the U.S. and abroad. He is a frequent contributor to national and international news outlets such as FOX News, CNN, BBC, New York Times, Wall Street Journal and Washington Post.
