Family Law Essentials Seminars

Since 2002, the Family Law
Essentials Seminars have provided
more than 9700 underserved
Texans with legal representation in
their family law cases.

Program founded 1995

Each year on Dia de Los Muertos, HIS and TAJTF host a virtual fundraiser based on the popular lotería game of chance played by Mexican families for decades.

The 'LAW TERIA' playing cards recognize notable Hispanic lawyers and figures throughout Texas history.

Last year, this event raised more than \$50k benfiting civil legal aid in Texas.

The Appellate Section Pro Bono Appeals Program matches parties seeking appellate assistance with volunteer attorneys throughout Texas.

Litigation Section



Provides four annual scholarships for legal aid attorneys for travel and tuition to the Litigation Update Course.



Funds charitable projects for services and publications that improve and/or increase access to the civil justice system.



Awards seven paid internships to legal aid providers for 3rd year law student interns from accredited Texas law schools.

Tax Section Bono Programs

Tax Court Pro Bono Program:

The United States Tax Court holds approximately 20–25 trial sessions each year in Texas as well as another 10-20 Virtual Settlement days for tax courts throughout the country.

Section volunteers meet with prose litigants to answer questions about legal issues and procedure, act as mediator with IRS Counsel, and advise how to present the case at trial. The volunteers generally do NOT enter an appearance before the United States Tax Court.

VITA Adopt-a-Base Training:

VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) provides instruction to volunteers who help prepare tax returns. The instruction includes the basics of tax returns, how to properly reporting income and deduction items, and any new changes to the Affordable Care Act.

The section provides training to at military bases throughout Texas via its Adopt-A-Base program.
