What is the DVHRT?

 We are a multidisciplinary team created to implement the most practical interventions for high-risk intimate partner violence cases in Fort Bend County to reduce continuing harm to victims and raise offender accountability.

 We share information across systems, monitor high-risk cases closely, and make community-based referrals to close systemic gaps.

What is the Lethality Assessment?

- Allows for more strategic response to high-danger situations
- The lethality assessment is evidence-based.
 - Developed by the Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence
- It is a way to assess the level of danger in an intimate partner relationship.
 - Partner LE agencies utilize the LAP during IPV
- Allows for identification of victims at greater risk of being killed.
 - Officers can determine risk based on score
 - Assessment does not determine risk factors for re-assault
- Connects victims with immediate services.
 - Officers contact hotline
 - Advocate safety plans with victim or through officer



Why Prioritize the Assessment?

- 1 in 4 women and 1 in 10 men experience sexual/physical violence and stalking by an intimate partner during their lifetime.
- In 2019, 185 Texans killed by an intimate partner
- 2020, 228 Texans killed
 - 23% increase
- 2021, 204 Texans killed
- 2022, 216 Texans killed
- For every 1 homicide, there are 8-9 near homicides.
- LAP concept is that IPV is predictable and therefore homicide is preventable.



After the Incident is Reported

- The victims have contact with the crime victim liaisons
- The high-risk cases are forwarded to Deputy Director of Victim Services
- Conduct follow-up calls to high-risk victims
- Cases closely monitored throughout the criminal process
