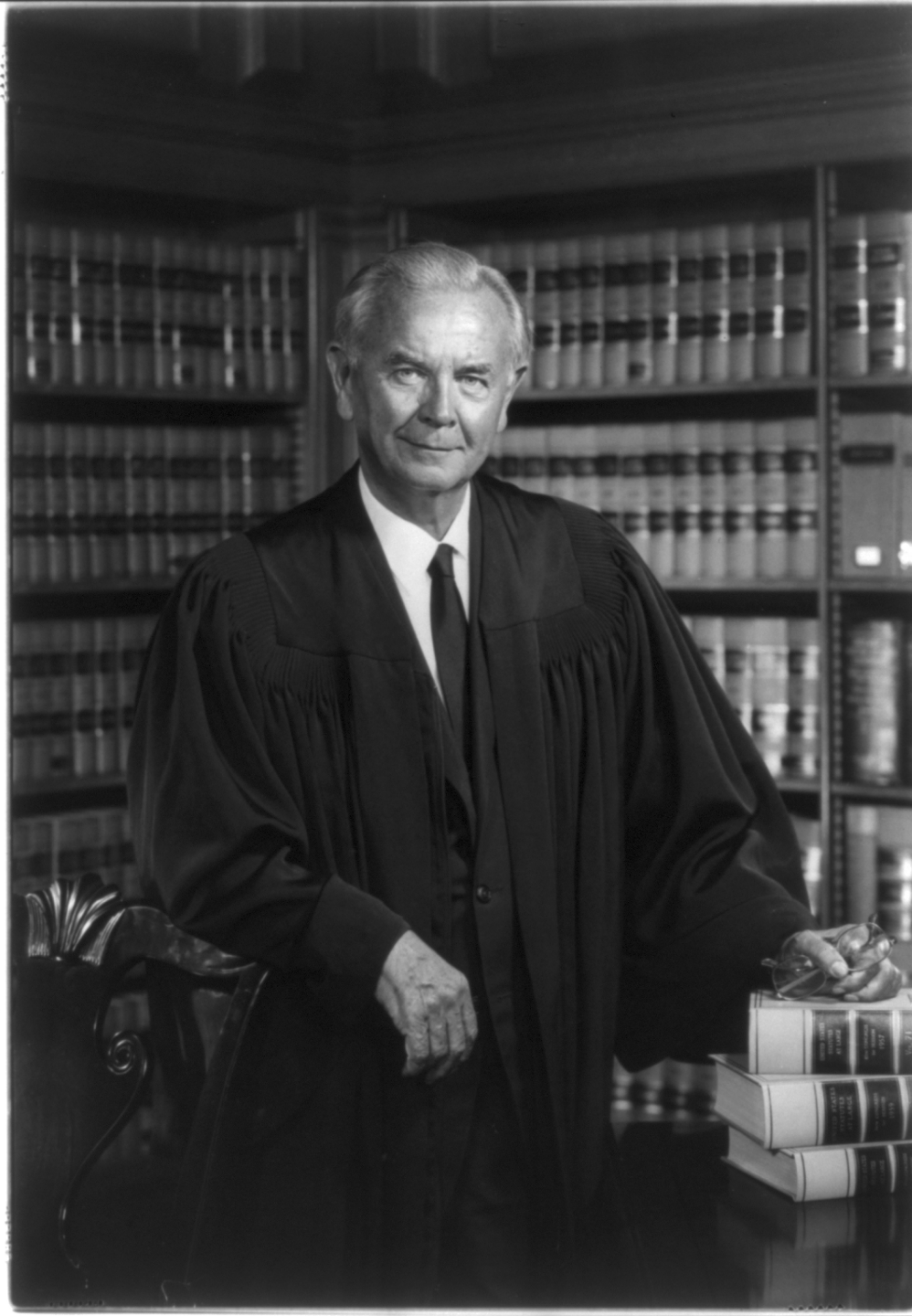

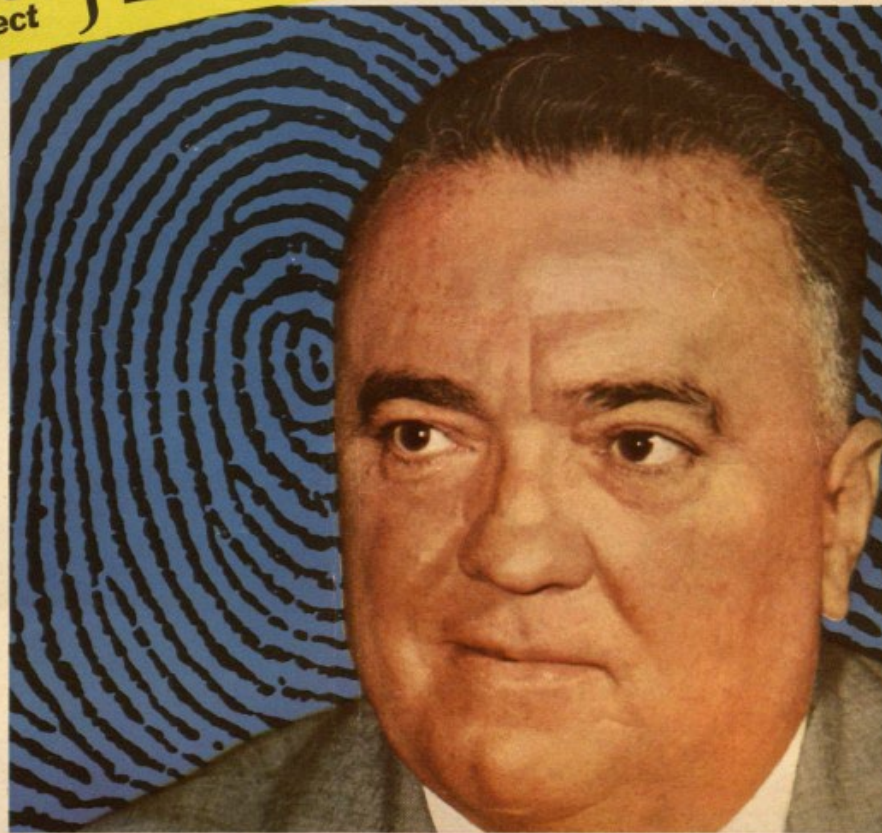

[redacted], whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised on December 9, 1949, that he attended a meeting on December 2, 1949, at the home of JOSEPH R. DI SANTI, 309 Caroline, Albuquerque, New Mexico. The following persons were present:

Informant stated this was an informal meeting called by DI SANTI to discuss developments in the Party organization. DI SANTI stated that there will be a state meeting of Communist Party members of New Mexico which will be held in Grant County December 20 and 21, 1949. The meeting is called for the purpose of reorganization of the State Board and handing out assignments to carry out district orders. DI SANTI stated this was necessary because CLINTON JENCKS was no longer in the Party, since he resigned in order that he could sign the non-Communist affidavit and comply with the provisions of the Taft-Hartley Act. He stated this was necessary for JENCKS to do in order that he could carry out his union affairs in the I.U.M.W.S.W. It was also necessary to reorganize the State Board, since the Party is largely becoming Mexican in the State of New Mexico and a Mexican should be included on the State Board.

“He [Ford] also testified that, as an officer of the Communist Party, as a member of the New Mexico State Board of the party, and also as the security officer of the party for all of that period, nothing had come to his attention up to the time of his severance from the Communist Party [September 1950] to indicate that the petitioner [Jencks] had withdrawn from the Communist Party.”

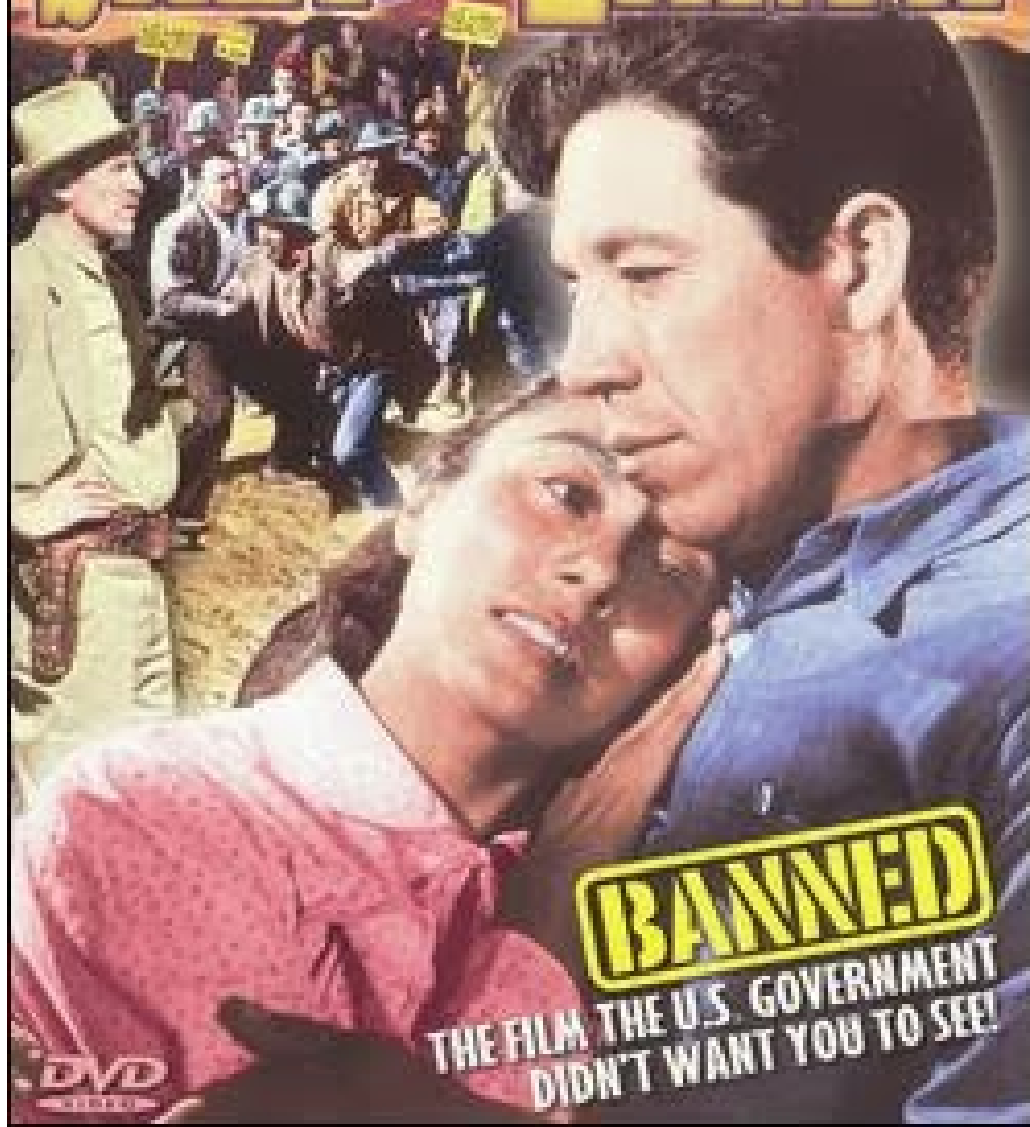
