Issues Facing Veterans

- In 2021, **76**% of low-income Veteran Households reported civil legal problems, **44**% experienced at least five civil legal problems.
- Low-income Veteran households did not receive any or enough legal help for 84% of their substantial civil legal problems.
- 72% of homeless Veterans in emergency shelters or other housing programs reported having a disability
- 7/10 unmet needs of homeless Veterans are legal issues








RESOURCES FOR Veterans Seeking Help
